



BUNSE DEVELOPMENTAL CHECKLIST

Instructions:

1. Before beginning Qigong Sensory Training therapy with your child, complete the Developmental Checklist.
2. Circle the tasks/activities that your child can do. You do not need to start with 0-4 months, if your child is quite a bit farther along developmentally. What you will want to do is to identify how far along your child is in each developmental area. So be certain to go far enough forward (older) in the task/activities list for each developmental area.
3. After using Qigong Sensory Training therapy on your child once a day for five months, have the same parent/caretaker review the Developmental Checklist again. Using a **different color pen**, circle what developmental tasks your child can now do. Once completed, review the checklist to see what developmental progress your child has made during the previous five months.
